Introduction

The foray will be in the Northwest Moraine Natural Region of Indiana. This is an area of high native plant diversity and a high percentage of rare plants. No other part of the state has such a diverse and rich flora. In part this is due to factors such as topographic relief, many niches and a variety *Moraine Nature Preserve Storage Building - Red Marks the Spot!* of microclimates. It is also an area where three major

ecological areas meet: The prairie area, the eastern deciduous forest and the northern boreal forest. The cold waters of Lake Michigan help keep conditions cooler near the lake providing conditions for plants that normally live much further north to live in the area.

Sites

We will meet at Moraine Nature Preserve headquarters and garage complex at 9 am each day. It is located ~5 miles northwest of Valparaiso. See above for location information. This will be our central gathering place and also where our scope work will be centered. It has a heated garage with windows, restroom, outlets, and kitchenette. Will have tables and chairs. Plan to bring an extension cord and power strip for scopes.

Friday 4/28

Moraine Nature Preserve

This is a large preserve of ~900 acres. Three main areas to explore: i) upland/ravine complex with many glacial erratics and boulders in the ravines, mature forest; ii) calcareous fen area with wooded kame; iii) mature forest with fairly rugged topography – used in past by University of Chicago for botanical education/research – donated to Preserve.



North of Valparaiso, IN, this preserve is an example of the many land forms associated with the Valparaiso Moraine. The nature preserve contains a combination of rolling ridges, steep hills, muck pockets, pot holes, and a shallow pond. Mature beech-maple forest is found on some of the uplands and ravines. Buttonbush and black willow surround a number of pot holes and ponds. Several upland areas are in various stages of succession.

Saturday 4/29

Ambler Nature Preserve

This is a large boreal flat woods, just south of Lake Michigan in Laporte County, with large areas of mature trees (area 500+ acres). It has flat poorly drained soils of a coarser texture with numerous areas of vernal pools, an area with mature trees and hummocks with Sphagnum mosses in places. Trees include red maple, northern pin oak, black gum, tulip tree, and white pine.

Sebert Woods Nature Preserve

This Nature Preserve (~ 40 acres), is located close to Ambler preserve (~3 miles). Contains remnant northern boreal flatwoods, mesic forest, and shrub swamp as well as their associated plant communities.

Wintergreen Woods Nature Preserve

Nature Preserve beside Sebert Nature Preserve (~23 acres). It is a remnant northern boreal flatwoods natural community. During wet seasons most of the preserve has standing water, due to poor drainage and the numerous "tip-ups" that occur when trees topple over during wind storms.

Sunday 4/30

Little Calumet Headwaters Nature Preserve

This 108 acre nature preserve is located within the Red Mill County Park. This preserve is located on and protects some of the headwaters of the Little Calumet River. The area contains seeps, spring runs, and upland forest.

John Merle Coulter Nature Preserve

This state-dedicated nature preserve of 80+ acres features a complex of sand prairie, oak savanna, and wetlands. More than 400 species of plants have been identified, many of them state-listed. This preserve is adjacent to National and Indiana State Dunes Park. Although these parks have been studied intensively, this preserve is fairly new and has no bryophyte or lichen records yet.

Lodging

There is plentiful lodging in nearby Valparaiso and Chesterton. There are also camp grounds nearby. In addition, Indiana DNR staff have offered permission to set up tents around the Moraine Nature Preserve headquarters area if anybody is interested. Restrooms and water will be available.




Location and Access: Pull-off parking and (old railroad bed) trail. From US 20 (Melton Rd), on the north side

along 5th Ave. Enter the preserve from County Line Rd.



John Merle Coulter Nature Preserve is located on the northwest side of Portage, between US 12 and US 20 on County Line Road. A gravel parking lot is located on the east side of County Line Road, just south of the Monosol plant. A loop trail traverses the property.




Location: Ambler Flatwoods Nature Preserve is located on the east side of Michigan City, south of US 12 on Meer Rd.

3. Wintergreen Woods Nature Preserve

Location: From the east side of Michigan City, go north on SR 212 to CR 900 N (about 2.7 miles). Turn right (east). The road jogs left, then right just before the preserve, becoming CR 925 N. The preserve is just past the intersection of CR 375 W and CR 925 N, on the north side of the road.



4. Sebert Woods Nature Preserve

<u>Location</u>: This preserve is just past the intersection of CR 375 W and CR 925 N, on the south side of the road. It is directly south of Wintergreen Woods Nature Preserve (see Wintergreen's description for further location details).




5. Moraine Nature Preserve

Location: From Valparaiso, go north on SR 49 to CR 600 N, turn right and then immediately left on CR 200 E. Take CR 200 E north to East CR 650 North. Turn right, the entrance to the Nature Preserve's Storage Building will be at 285 East 650 North Valparaiso, IN 46383. It will on the north side of the road.



6. Little Calumet Nature Preserve

Latitude/Longitude 41.6032284,-86.8823053

Laporte County

<u>Location</u>: Parking and trail. This preserve is due west of LaPorte. From the north, take US 421 south to the intersection of CR 100 N and Holmesville Rd, at Beattys Corner. Turn left (southeast) onto Holmesville Rd and go about 2.5 miles. The entrance and parking are on the left. From LaPorte, take SR 2 west about 7.5 miles to S. Holmesville Rd. Turn north (right) and go about 2.5 miles. The entrance and parking lot are on the right.
