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OHIO LIVERWORTS

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The liverworts (Hepaticae) known to occur in Ohio have been cited in numerous publications but no recent attempt has been made to account for species present or their distribution within the state. With the increasing interest now being shown in providing detailed distributional data for the Ohio vascular plant flora (as implied, e.g., by Cooperrider, 1961), similar data for Hepaticae should be of interest also.




FIGURE 1. Known distribution of Hepaticae in Ohio, by counties. The number of species presently known for each county is indicated. Counties with no reported species are hatched, those with 1 to 9 species are shaded, those with 10 to 19 species are stippled, and those with 20 or more species are white. (Base map courtesy of Miami University Geography Department, details by Miss J. Gotter).

Liverworts are less abundant than mosses in Ohio and fewer species are known. Nonetheless, 122 species of hepatics compared to 331 species of mosses (Giesy, 1957) suggests a relatively rich hepatic flora for a mesophytic temperate region. The wealth of species already known for a heavily collected region, i.e., southeastern Ohio, suggests that additions to the present list and meaningful range extensions can be expected when collections are made from the many unexplored counties (fig. 1).

The collections deposited in The Ohio State University Herbarium reflect that moss collectors (see Giesy, 1957) are also hepatic collectors. Thus, specimens prepared by Hannah J. Biddlecome, E. Jane Spence, W. C. Werner, Edo Claassen, H. C. Beardslee, C. H. Coles, and R. C. Wareham comprise a significant part of the collections. In addition, there were abundant collections from Hocking and nearby counties made by Mary S. (Mrs. Bayard R.) Taylor. It is clear from the richness of the collections that Mrs. Taylor has made a considerable contribution to Ohio hepaticology and has probably collected more species of Hepaticae in Ohio than anyone else.

We have not attempted to account for every collection cited for Ohio or to examine every specimen ever collected. Every county record listed is based on a specimen in The Ohio State University Herbarium unless noted MU for the Miami University Herbarium or ABSH for The American Bryological Society Hepatic Herbarium at The University of Cincinnati. It is obvious from figure 1 that much field work remains to be done before margins of the distributional patterns can be established.

The numerous changes in nomenclature and many new discoveries within Ohio since the last list appeared over fifty years ago are incorporated below. If the species is reported from one or more adjacent states, we have noted that fact, but we have not attempted to outline the total distribution for any species. It is hoped that this preliminary report will stimulate a renewed interest in Ohio liverworts.

Blepharozia ciliaris Dum. (Beardslee, 1876) = Ptilidium ciliare (L.) Hampe. Doubtfully present in Ohio. The record is apparently based on specimens of Ptilidium pulcherrimum (Web.) Hampe which we have seen. The two species were not distinguished by "Gray's Manual."

Cephalozia curvifolia (Dicks.) Dum. (Beardslee, 1876) = Nowellia curvifolia (Dicks.) Mitt. Cephalozia sullivantii Aust. (Beardslee, 1876) = Cephaloziella sullivantii (Aust.) Evans.

Chiloscyphus ascendens Hook. & Wils. (Beardslee, 1876) Misprint for C. adscendens (Hook & Wils.)

Wils.) Sulliv. = Chiloscyphus pallescens (Ehrh.) Dum.

Chiloscyphus polyanthus var. rivularis Syn. Hep. (Beardslee, 1876) ≡ Chiloscyphus rivularis

(Schrad.) Loeske.

Fimbriaria tenella Nees. (Beardslee, 1876) = Asterella tenella (L.) Beauv.
Frullania aeolotis Nees. (Beardslee, 1876 = Frullania riparia Hampe.
Frullania inflata Gott. (Frye and Clark, 1947) Erroneously reported from Ohio. Evans' (1897) revision of Frullania did not cite Ohio material.

Grimaldia rupestris (Nees) Lindenb. (Underwood, 1895)≡Mannia rupestris (Nees.) Frye & Clark.

Jungermannia excisa Dicks. (Beardslee, 1876) ≡ Lophozia excisa (Dicks.) Dum. We have seen no specimens of this northern species which should, for the present, be excluded from the flora of Ohio.

Jungermannia crenulata Smith (Beardslee, 1876)≡Solenostoma creunlatum (Smith) Mitt.

Jungermannia crenuliformis Aust. (Beardslee, 1876) = Plectocolea crenuliformis (Aust.) Mitt. Jungermannia hyalina Lyell. (Beardslee, 1876) = Plectocolea hyalina (Lyell) Mitt. Jungermannia pumila With. (Hall, 1958) = Solensotoma pumilum (With.) Steph.

Lejeunia calcarea Libert. (Sullivant, 1848) Probably Cololejeunea biddlecomiae (Aust.) Evans, a species not yet recognized in 1848 (See Frye and Clark, 1947).

Lejeunia echinata Tayl. (Beardslee, 1876) Probably Cololejeunea biddlecomiae (Aust.) Evans

(See Frye and Clark, 1947).

Lejeunea patens Lindb. (Frye and Clark, 1947) = Lejeunea lamacerina Gott. ex. Steph. ssp. gemninata Schuster.

Liochloena lanceolata Nees. (Beardslee, 1876)≡Jungermannia lanceolata L.

Lophocolea macouni Aust. (Beardslee, 1876) = Lophocolea heterophylla (Schrad.) Dum. Lunularia vulgaris (Beardslee, 1876) = Lunularia cruciata (L.) Dum.

Madotheca platyphylla Dum. (Beardslee, 1876) = Porella platyphylla (L.) Lindb. Madotheca platyphylla var. navicularis Nees. (Beardslee, 1876) We have been unable to find this combination cited in any of the usual places. It is most probable that the specimen involved was *Porella platyphylloidea* (Schwein.) Lindb. *Porella navicularis* is a western species and its presence in Ohio would be most unusual.

Madotheca porella Nees. (Beardslee, 1876) = Porella pinnata L.

Madotheca rivularis Nees. (Beardslee, 1876) = Porella cordeana (Huben.) Evans a Pacific coast species most like P. pinnata L. to which this report doubtless should be assigned.

Mastigobryum trilobatum Nees. ≡ Bazzania trilobata (L.) S. F. Gray.

Notothylas melanospora Sulliv. (Sullivant, 1848) = Notothylas oribularis (Schwein.) Sulliv.

Notothylas valvata Sulliv. (Sullivant, 1848) = Nothylas orbicularis (Schwein.) Sulliv. Norwellia (sic!) curvifolia (Dicks.) Mitt. (Hall, 1958) Misprint for Nowellia.

Odontoschisma hubeneriana Rabenh. (Beardslee, 1876) = Odontoschisma denudatum (Mart.)

Odontoschisma scutata (Web.) Aust. (Beardslee, 1876)≡Harpanthus scutatus (Web. & Mohr) Spr.

Odontoschisma sphagni (Dicks.) Dum. (Underwood, 1884) often confused with Odontoschisma denudatum (Mart.) Dum. (see Frye and Clark, 1944). Until specimens are found, O. sphagni should be excluded from the Ohio Flora.

Phragmicoma clypeata Sulliv. (Beardslee, 1876) Leucolejeunea clypeata (Schwein.) Evans.

Plagiochila macrostoma Sulliv. (Sullivant, 1848) Misprinted "microstoma" in Frye and Clark (1943) = Pedinophyllum interruptum (Nees.) Lindb.

Plagiochila porelloides Lindb. (Beardslee, 1876) = Plagiochila asplenoides (L.) Dum.

Plagiochila sullivantii Gott. in Evans (Frye and Clark, 1944) Erroneously reported on basis of Conklin (1923) but it is not listed there.

Plectocolea crenulata (Smith) Evans. (Hall, 1958)≡Solenostoma crenulata (Smith) Steph. Riccia frostii Aust. (Underwood, 1894) Specimens not seen. Doubtfully present in Ohio. Riccia huebeneriana Lindb. (Underwood, 1894) = Riccia sullivantii Aust. (See Frye and Clark,

Riccia lutescens Schwein. (Underwood, 1894) = Ricciocarpus natans (L.) Corda.

Riccia membranacea Gott. & Lindb. (Frye and Clark, 1937) Based on Underwood's (1894) report of R. tenuis. No specimens have been seen and the species is doubtfully present in Ohio. Riccia tenuis Aust. (Underwood, 1894) = Riccia membranacea Gott. & Lindb. which is doubtfully present in Ohio.

Sarcoscyphus sphacelatus Nees. (Beardslee, 1876)≡Marsupella sphacelata (Gieseke) Dum. Scapania albicans var. taxifolia minor Aust. (Beardslee, 1876) = Diplophyllum apiculatum (Evans) Steph.

Steezia İyellii Lehm. (Beardslee, 1876)≡Pallavicinia lyellii (Hook.) S. F. Gray.

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
